To whom it may concern,

I am writing to request a religious accommodation per the BC Human Rights Code¹ and the Canadian Human Rights Act² to the COVID-19 vaccine requirement for employees.

I am a Sola Scriptura Christian that practices a faith-based life centred on the whole Biblical teaching, including both Old and New Covenant Scriptures. My biblical understanding requires me to prioritize what the Scriptures teach before all other earthly authority. As the Apostle Peter said: "We are obligated to obey God, rather than any human authority.³

To get a COVID-19 vaccination would violate my long held and sincerely practiced religious beliefs. Below are some of the prime reasons:

Sanctity of Human Life

The Christian Church in the 1st century AD recognized the Law and the Prophets as authoritative.⁴ Thus, there are a number of scriptural references that specifically relate to the sanctity of human life. Firstly, it is my sincere belief that life starts at conception and is given purpose before conception.⁵ In particular, scripture gives a specific legal argument for the punishment for abortion caused by physical harm of the unborn in a mother's womb.⁶ Life of the unborn has a purpose determined before birth.⁷ Therefore abortion is the sin of murder.⁸ Sin is defined as a transgression of the law⁹ and we believe no one can enter into eternal life if they are a murderer.¹⁰

It is a point of scientific fact that the current COVID-19 vaccine injections have all used aborted human fetal cells and cell lines in various research, development, production, and manufacturing phases of these products.¹¹

Scriptural Holiness Code

The Scriptures call a believer's body the temple of the Holy Spirit and that Christians are called to be holy just as God is holy.¹²

As part of our biblical calling to live a holy life, we are specifically prohibited from eating blood. We are told life is in the blood.¹³ Therefore to consume or inject any such substance derived from the blood of another into the body would be violating this command.¹⁴

Additionally vaccines contain hazardous substances including: neurotoxins, carcinogens, attenuated viruses, albumin from human blood, animal parts and cell proteins, foreign DNA, artificial mRNA and chemical wastes that are proven harmful to the human body.¹⁵

In fact, there are broad scriptural prohibitions against consuming or even touching anything that might defile the body, and consequently the conscience.¹⁶

Biblical holiness is paramount in actively living out the Christian Faith in accordance with the key principle of *sola scriptura*.

Faithful Adherence to Religious Practice

In harmony with the scriptural instruction I observe Sabbath and annual Holy Days, in that I cease from doing work and do not engage in personal recreational pursuits.¹⁷

I strictly adhere to the Scriptural Food Laws, including abstaining from any part of an unclean animal, and not just the flesh.¹⁸

I abstain from using any substance that can permanently alter/or harm brain chemistry or other bodily functions¹⁹ and which also conflicts with the Holiness principles stated above.

Therefore, I do not take vaccinations for the aforementioned reasons.

Accommodation of Faithful Religious Observance

Belief is not enough, neither can faith function without works; action through faith of the believer is required.²⁰

Conscience and faith

As a follower of Jesus Christ and the Christian life based on the *Sola-Scriptura principle* - by scriptures (Hebrew and Greek) alone, I do not rely on church traditions as my guide to faith.²¹ Accordingly, I do not recognize the pronouncements of religious institutions and their faith leaders, or their doctrines and traditions that are contrary to Scripture. Applied specifically to COVID-19 vaccinations, I find 'ethical' pronouncements by institutions and leaders in favour of consumption and injection of products that use human fetal cell lines in their research, testing and development to be in direct contradiction with the Word of God, and therefore invalid.

Scripture is clear that whatever is not of faith is sin, and God requires a Christian to have a pure heart and clean conscience before Him.²² To consent to take the COVID-19 vaccination would require me to violate the biblically based principles set out above. For me to submit to any of these mandated medical treatment(s) would be a breach of my faith, conscience, and God's commandments—being a direct violation of the scriptural principles mentioned previously.

Therefore, I request a religious accommodation for me in line with the principles of inclusion and diversity that are grounded in the Charter of Rights, and
